

CRAC'S NEW SAVANNAH BRIAN GREENWOOD

CRAC's new-build ICP Savannah S is online and available for hire at a reasonable \$150 per hour.

This is the aircraft which was purchased by the committee to have a club build project - with a view to providing a syndicate with a good entry point to an aircraft and a learning project for club members.

The build progressed at a good rate for a while, with Graeme Main and others providing a lot of the work. Sadly, with Graeme's passing in June last year, the project stalled. Without a program to complete the aircraft, the committee took the decision to sell the incomplete project.

Doug Anderson, Chris Pennell, and Peter Collins approached the committee with a plan to finish the aircraft for the club, provided it was taken on as a club aircraft for a minimum of 12 months. The committee gratefully accepted, although the commitment was negotiated to be subject to a review every three months for financial reasons. The new build group, headed by Ray Corbett, is very experienced in Savannahs, and has incredibly high standards of workmanship. Some remediation was carried out and the finished product is a testament to their skills.



The new build group tried to register the aircraft in the club's RGx range but most of them were taken, so they got SGM in honour of Graeme. A very fitting registration.







CFI Glenn Martin and the Instructors have come up with three different syllabuses based on the needs of the trainee. These range from a type conversion through to the full off-field experience.

A couple of weeks ago, we took half an hour of club time and did some air to airs of SGM, appropriately flown by Chris Pennell. The camera ship was provided and flown by the redoubtable Roy Waddingham. Thanks to both of you for a very enjoyable morning.



FAREWELL INGENUITY

Some news from NASA that I find surprisingly sad, their plucky Mars helicopter, Ingenuity, has finally had to end its mission.

After losing contact with Ingenuity during a simple hover test flight, the Perseverance rover regained contact after mission controllers commanded a "long duration listening session". It was during the blackout period when Ingenuity damaged one of its four blades. One assumes it had a bumpy landing; it seems unlikely that it hit something in the air.



Ingenuity was a proof-of-concept test that just kept on giving, an attempt to build a device capable of flying in the incredibly harsh environment of Mars. Scorching radiation, an atmosphere of 1% of Earth's, dust storms, and a gravity of just .38 Gs are some of the items it had to cope with.

The hope was that the device would survive a small number of flights, however Ingenuity has flown 72 times for a total time of more than two hours, over a three-year period. It has provided us with some different perspectives of Mars than the ground-based rovers and scouted for better routes.

An amazing NASA success story.
